

VULTOURIS ROUTES: Benasa Gorge (Navarra)



A walk through the lower stretch of the Foz de Benasa. It's a short, magnificent route that sets off from the recreational area and river-fed swimming pool. Cross the footbridge and take the path that can be seen running along the river's edge, until it divides in two. Do not continue down the dirt road here. Instead, take the route that crosses the river to pick up the trail again on the other side, where it continues directly to the gorge.

The beautiful entrance of the gorge and the walk inside it stand out above all on the route. The gorge interior is inhabited by a great variety of tree species as well as several cliff nesting birds characteristic to the area; griffon vultures, chough, jackdaw and more. The gorge is a declared Site of Community Importance (SIC), forming part of the Natura 2000 network.

This walk is recommendable for the whole family without exception. It can be easily complemented by a visit to the church of Santa María del Campo, located just outside the town of Navascués.
