


VULTOURIS ROUTES: Lumbier Gorge (Navarra)

DIFFICULTY:
MODERATE



The walk begins at the Foz de Lumbier recreational area on a dirt road that ascends to the left and is indicated with an informative panel. The route is adequately marked with green and white blazes (SL-113).

Ascending along the hillsides of the Sierra de Leire, the route passes through scrubland and agricultural fields until arriving at the Alzueta farmyard (corral de Alzueta). Moving onward the route descends along a dirt road that runs into the Lumbier-Liédena path. Continuing on the path, the walk leads toward the gorge.



The last leg skirts along the interior of the Lumbier Gorge Nature Reserve, thanks to the former railway line of the Irati Train (the first electric train in Spain). Two tunnels, one to enter and one to leave, grant access to the gorge.

The objective of the declaration of this area as a Nature Reserve is the conservation of its land and its inhabitants. To that end there is a set of rules that prohibit:

- any form of littering, including leaving behind disposable objects or materials, any form of liquid or material waste and the use of objects that produce residue/ash etc..
- the use of speakers or any other instrument or device that makes loud noise or noises that could disturb fauna.
- any action that destroys, alters or harms flora.
- all disruption, chasing, capturing or mistreatment of fauna and its habitat.

A wide variety of birds are observed along the route whose lives are dependent upon the rocks. Some species inhabit the gorge throughout the year, like griffon vultures, red-billed chough and jackdaw, while others only in spring and summer; crag martin, alpine swift and Egyptian vultures among others..
