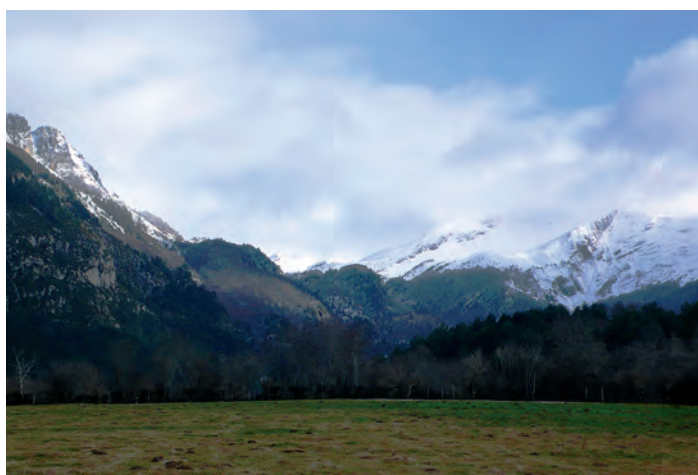


VULTOURIS ROUTES: Rincón de Belagua (Navarra)



Start out heading right from the Mata de Haya parking area to proceed into the forest. 10 minutes in, the path begins an ascent toward the right and continues along the mountainside for approximately an hour. Once arriving at the road, walk for another ten minutes to reach the Arrako dolmen. From the dolmen, one must follow the same route back for 30 minutes until arriving at a signpost and turning onto the dirt road la Dronda. The road descends along the river and continues on until Mata de Haya.

Over the course of the walk, one can observe different habitats, beginning with a beech-fir forest containing gorgeous, exemplary holly trees. Further along, the route crosses a channel of glacial origin be-

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fore leading to an area of grassland that is complemented with Scots pine and an abundance of juniper bushes, boxwood and hawthorn, among others.

While passing through the forest, if one goes in silence, it's possible to hear the black woodpecker, or at sundown see one of the local mammals; roe deer, wild boar, or fox. It's also possible to observe the movement of scavenging birds in the area due to the presence of rock walls near the route.

Finally, it's worth noting the beautiful panorama of the Belagua Valley afforded on the second half of the walk, with views of the Lakartxela Mountains and the area of Arrakogoti.
